Janet Powers, Photographer and Retired Gettysburg College Professor

FIGHTING POVERTY WITH TRADITIONAL CRAFTS IN BOSNIA

Beginning with the post-war situation in Bosnia, Powers will describe three Bosnian women's groups and how these groups are using traditional crafts to create new products and to earn money. A major focus

will be on "Sarajevo Phoenix," a group of fourteen women whose embroidered and crocheted products are marketed on ETSY and in south-central Pennsylvania at bazaars and arts councils. The lecture will take place in conjunction with Power's photography exhibit, "The Balkan Backstory", in CALC's upper gallery.

We will explore 3 different methods of creating simple prints. The images will be created on paper and then mounted or matted into a display.



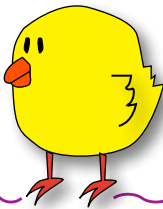

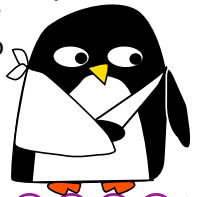

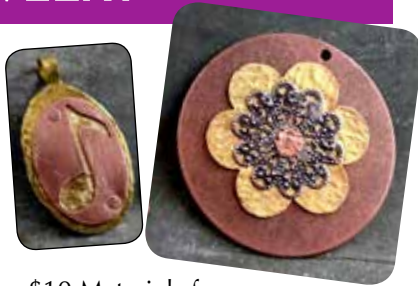

Class 3 - Held at the **Red Tomato Farm** to utilize their pit to fire pieces after application of masking and super low fire glazes. Class will include loading the pit & firing it. Work will be cleaned of residual ash and a varnish applied.
