Learn the basics of Indigo dyeing and Shibori, an ancient Japanese resist technique on cloth. The first week you will explore bound, clamped and sewn Shibori methods on cotton and silk. Students can take cloth home to continue the sewn resists. At the second class you will dye your fabric after the class makes an organic indigo vat using local honey and a synthetic indigo vat. Students may bring a cotton t-shirt from home to dye at the second class if they wish. **Please wear old clothes.**

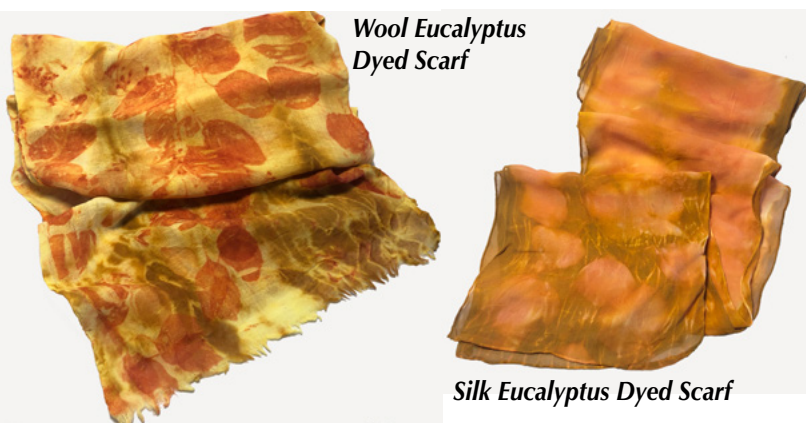

Learn to naturally dye a one-of-a-kind scarf. We'll use fresh eucalyptus leaves to create a unique pattern on a wool or silk scarf. See the magic the Eco-dyeing the leaves will impart their color to the cloth, and since we'll be "cooking" our scarves in marigold dye they will be lovely shades of gold and orange. You'll learn about the history of Eco-dyeing, good dye technique and how to care for your scarf. While the scarves are dyeing, we'll explore the magic of indigo and dye a cotton bandana blue.
